What's your story?

"A soldier in Indonesia bought a monkey as a pet. He soon noticed that the monkey was very sensitive around its waist. One day he looked closely and saw a raised bump in that area, and lifting its fur, he saw what had happened. When the monkey was small, someone had tied a wire around its waist and forgotten to remove it. The wire had become embedded in the monkey's flesh. That night, the soldier shaved the fur around the wire and very carefully removed it. During all this time, the monkey lay there, opening and closing its eyes and showing infinite patience. As soon as the operation was finished, the monkey jumped for joy and leaped into the soldier's arms, hugging him tightly" (Mark Link, SJ, Challenge, p. 130).

Nineteen-year-old Patricia Sandoval began dating a man five years older than her. They had sex, and she became pregnant. They decided to keep the baby, but a friend told her she was "making a grave mistake," which made her change her mind. Without her boyfriend's knowledge, she made an appointment at an abortion clinic. She was terrified, but the doctor told her she had had two abortions herself, had performed two on her own daughter, and that it would only take five minutes. She says that during the abortion, she felt like a traitor. She was aware she was doing something awful, but on the other hand, she felt relieved to be rid of the "problem." She simply told her boyfriend that she had lost the baby. Just five months after the first abortion, Patricia discovered she was pregnant again. She didn't tell anyone, not even her boyfriend, and immediately made an appointment at Planned Parenthood because "it was too embarrassing to go back to the first clinic where I had just had my first abortion. The second abortion was quick, and no one knew about it."

But a few months later, she became pregnant again. This time she did tell her partner, who was overjoyed. However, she didn't want the baby and convinced her boyfriend not to have it. She forced him to accompany her to the abortion; he was terrified. At that moment, Patricia remembered that, although he didn't know it, this was her third abortion. She says she felt like a murderer. "I felt incredibly guilty, like a murderer. I had helped women kill their children while working for a time at Planned Parenthood, and I had murdered my own children. With her self-esteem at rock bottom, she started dating a drug addict who introduced her to cocaine, methamphetamines, and crack. When that destructive relationship ended, she was left on the streets, completely alone and abandoned. She was 22 years old. One day, while I was crying in a ditch, a young woman approached me and said, 'Jesus loves you.' She was a waitress from a nearby bar who, after inviting me to lunch, offered to take me to her father's house, whom I hadn't seen in over three years. "I arrived at his house. My father opened the door and found me skin and bones. I asked for his forgiveness, and he took me in. In that process of forgiveness, Patricia confessed to her abortions, but she still felt deep pain for what she had done." Her body had healed by overcoming her addictions, but her soul had not yet healed from her three abortions (Website). For many years now, by the grace of God, Patricia has been a completely new person, just as God in His Mercy rescued Lazarus from the tomb of sin and perdition.

Question: Do you remember an experience in your life in which Jesus brought you out of the tomb?

DDD,

Each year, the diocese allocates a quota to each parish based on each parish's income. You may have some questions regarding the DDD. I will try to answer them using the following example: Imagine the diocese as a very large family: 12 children, each with their own family. However, the twelve children, along with their parents, carry out a mission together, for which they need to contribute financially to a common fund. In this case, the parents assign a quota to each child based on their income. In this way, the family sustains itself and carries out its mission.

The Diocese of Salt Lake City is that family, the children are each parish and the Bishop is the head of the family. Now, Notre Dame de Lourdes parish was extremely financially blessed in 2025. For that reason the DDD quota for 2026 has also increased significantly, we have been assigned \$138,900.00.

This number may seem large at first but our parish was extremely blessed last year. From that amount, we as a community will be responsible only for \$38,900.00. Thank God and a generous donator who gave us \$10,000.00, for DDD, we only need to collect \$28,900.00, and the rest will be covered with part of the funds the parish received as donations last year.

How are we going to collect the \$28,900.00? I have asked Jennifer Warner and Savannah Riche to be in charge of collecting all donations for DDD in the parish. That is, you inform either of them how much you are going to donate to the DDD. You can give it to them in cash, by check, or simply let them know you will make your donation online, in which case you indicate the amount of your contribution.

May God bless you abundantly for all your generosity.
