Divine Mercy in action.

Donald H. Calloway's parents met and married in one of the poorest mountain towns in West Virginia. He was born when his mother was only eighteen years old, and his last name comes from his second adoptive father. Due to the lack of work in Clarksburg, they moved to Michigan, where his father found a good job. However, as soon as he started earning money, he began to squander it on alcohol and drugs, which caused the marriage to deteriorate until it finally ended in divorce. As a result, young Donald had to return to live with his maternal grandparents, and his biological father who was absent for many years of his life.

When Donald was eight years old, his mother remarried a man from Martinsville, West Virginia. They moved into a trailer, but his new father was a lazy, drug and alcohol-addicted man. His mother decided to enlist in the Navy. During her training, she left her son with her husband. When she finally returned, Donald was overjoyed to have his mother back, dreaming they would never be separated again. She had been assigned to the Norfolk base, known as the largest naval base in the world. This move and life change led to another divorce, as her husband didn't want to leave West Virginia and wasn't happy that she was the sole provider. By then, Donald was nine years old and fell in love for the first time with a girl, even committing his first theft to buy her a gift.

When he was ten, his mother married her third husband, Officer Calloway. He recounts that during the wedding, he wondered, "How long will this marriage last? What's going to happen to this guy?" His new stepfather was an Episcopalian, which is why Donald was baptized into this Christian denomination. From then on, this family lived in Norfolk, Virginia Beach, San Pedro, Ca, San Diego, Ca, and Japan. But throughout this journey, Donald's spiritual wound began to bleed uncontrollably. At age 11, he started smoking marijuana, and soon he tried alcohol and became frequently drunk. At every school he attended, he hung out with the worst students of his age. While living in Japan, he ran away from home for a long time, even while living on a military base, becoming a delinquent of interest to the Japanese government, until they finally managed to capture him and deport him to the United States, along with his parents.

If you read the Confessions of Saint Augustine, you'll find that the story of Father Donald H. Calloway— now a priest—surpasses even that of the saint of Hippo in terms of his past life of wrongdoing. He didn't die from an overdose or in a car accident. He wasn't killed in a robbery or a fight. Instead, he was saved because God's mercy is infinite and His plan for each of us remains, no matter how far we may fall in life.

ON THE THIRD DAY HE ROSE FROM THE DEAD

"We bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, this day he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus." The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ, a faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community; handed on as fundamental by Tradition; established by the documents of the New Testament; and preached as an essential part of the Paschal mystery along with the cross:

Christ is risen from the dead!
Dying, he conquered death;
To the dead, he has given life.

THE HISTORICAL AND TRANSCENDENT EVENT

The mystery of Christ's resurrection is a real event, with manifestations that were historically verified, as the New Testament bears witness. In about A.D. 56 St. Paul could already write to the Corinthians: "I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve. . ." The Apostle speaks here of the living tradition of the Resurrection which he had learned after his conversion at the gates of Damascus" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, nn. 638-639).
