## **On the 250 years of foundation of the United States (third part).**

“Monsignor John A. Ryan, head of the NCWC's Department of Social Action, played a crucial role in developing the moral framework that would inspire President Franklin Roosevelt's New Deal policies. In 1970, the bishops launched the Catholic Campaign for Human Development, a domestic anti-poverty program that continues to fund groups led by low-income individuals seeking to address the root causes of poverty in their communities. In 1966, the National Conference of Catholic Bishops (NCCB) and the United States Catholic Conference (USCC) were established, evolving from the NCWC. The NCCB attended to matters specific to the Church in this country, fulfilling the mandate of the Second Vatican Council that bishops “exercise their pastoral office jointly” (Decree on the Pastoral Office of Bishops, no. 38). In 2001, the NCCB and the USCC merged to form the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).

Throughout the 20th century, Catholic social justice teaching became deeply rooted, a fact reflected in the founding of the Catholic Worker Movement by Dorothy Day and Peter Maurin in 1933, Catholic labor activism, and the involvement of the Maryknoll community and other religious orders in missionary work across the globe. The Church played an active role in the Civil Rights Movement. In 1960, John F. Kennedy became the first Catholic to be elected President of the United States.

In 1900, it was estimated that there were 3,500 parochial schools in the United States. Within the span of the next 20 years, the number of elementary schools had reached 6,551, with 1,759,673 students being taught by 41,581 teachers. Likewise, secondary education expanded significantly. In 1900, Catholics had approximately 100 Catholic high schools, but by 1920, there were more than 1,500. For over two generations, enrollment continued to rise. By the mid-1960s, it had reached an all-time high of 4.5 million students in elementary school and nearly 1 million students in Catholic high schools. Four decades later, total elementary and secondary enrollment stands at 2.6 million. Today, there are 8,000 Catholic schools in the United States.

The United States received its first papal visits in the years following the Second Vatican Council—specifically, from Paul VI (1965); ...several visits by John Paul II — including the only World Youth Day held in the United States, in Denver (1993) —and Benedict XVI (2008). All three popes delivered addresses before the United Nations. In 2002, the bishops of the United States adopted the \*Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People\*, a landmark document in the Church's response to the sexual abuse of minors by some clergy. The standards set forth in the Charter have been adopted by the Vatican and are being implemented worldwide to ensure that the Catholic Church is a safe environment for children” ([www.usccb.org](http://www.usccb.org)).

### Grief and Grace

In the article written by Patrick O'Hearn, he explains that losing a child is one of the deepest kinds of grief a father can experience, but faith, prayer, and support from others can help bring healing and hope. He explains that when tragedy happens, people may struggle with doubt and sadness, but trusting in God can give them strength to continue. The article uses the example of Karol Wojtyła Sr. (the father of Pope John Paul II), who turned to prayer after losing family members, showing how faith helped him endure suffering.

The author also explains that grief can lead people toward unhealthy coping methods such as isolation, alcohol, or distractions, which can hurt both the person and their relationships. Instead, he encourages grieving fathers to seek comfort through Christ and through friendships with people who understand their pain. The writer shares his own experience of miscarriages in his family and how meeting another grieving father helped him feel less alone. "The way of healing is to turn first to Christ, the Wounded Healer, and then to others who can help us our carry our cross."

Overall, the message of the article is that grief should not be carried alone. Fathers should allow themselves to mourn in a healthy way, pray for healing, and connect with supportive people. Through faith, friendship, and openness, it is possible to find grace and hope even after painful loss.
