Who Sows the Bad Seed?

"The evil that exists in the world is the result of the intervention in us and in our society of a dark and enemy agent, the Devil. Evil is no longer just a deficiency, but a living, spiritual being, perverted and perverting. A terrible reality. Mysterious and terrifying. Anyone who refuses to acknowledge its existence departs from the framework of biblical and ecclesiastical teaching; and likewise, anyone who considers it an autonomous principle, something that does not originate in God like all creation, or who explains it as a pseudo-reality, as a conceptual and fantastical personification of the unknown causes of our misfortunes, also departs. The Devil is the number one enemy, the tempter par excellence. We know that this dark and disturbing being truly exists and continues to act; he uses confused social relationships to introduce deviation into us..." (Paul VI, Address at the General Audience, November 15, 1972).

"Whatever some superficial theologians may say, the Devil is, for the Christian faith, a mysterious but real presence, not merely symbolic, but personal. And he is a powerful reality ("the Prince of this world," as the New Testament calls him, repeatedly reminding us of his existence), a malevolent, superhuman freedom beyond that of God; this is shown to us by a realistic reading of history, with its abyss of continually renewed atrocities that cannot be explained merely by human behavior. Man alone has no strength to oppose Satan; but he is not another god; united with Jesus, we can be certain of defeating him, for he has the power and the will to liberate us; for this reason, the Gospel is the Good News, and for this reason we must continue to proclaim it in those "regimes" of fear that are frequently non-Christian religions. But if this redeeming light of Christ were to be extinguished, despite all its wisdom and all its technology, the world would again fall into terror and despair. And signs can already be seen. This return of dark forces coincides with the resurgence of satanic cults in the secularized world" (Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger, Vittorio Messori, Report on the Faith, p. 143).

A grandfather wanted to explain the existence of good and evil in human beings to his grandson, so he said: "In each person there are two wolves, one good and one bad, and they are constantly fighting each other. The boy asked: 'Which one will win the battle?' 'The one you feed,' the old man replied." When we feed the bad wolf, it becomes difficult for us to attend Mass, go to confession, or pray. The bad wolf feeds on alcohol, drugs, social media, pornography, and all the garbage that surrounds us daily. The good news is that the good wolf can win this battle, but to do so we need to pray without giving up, go to confession frequently, receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, and strive to remain spiritually awake, because the bad wolf will not stop trying to sow his seed in us until we leave this world.

Question: How do I guard my inner life to prevent the enemy from sowing his seeds?

At Home with Jesus

In the article "At Home with Jesus" the author Allan Wright says that Catholic families should make their homes places where Jesus is welcomed and where faith is practiced every day. He explains that many important events in Jesus' ministry took place in ordinary homes, including meals, teachings, and the Last Supper. Because of this, the home should be more than just a place to live—it should be a place where families grow closer to God and one another. The author describes the family as a "domestic church," where parents play the most important role in teaching their children about the faith through both their words and their actions. He stresses that children learn best by seeing love, forgiveness, prayer, and kindness modeled in their daily lives.

To help families live out their faith, the author suggests simple but meaningful practices such as praying together, creating a prayer corner, celebrating saints' feast days, blessing children before they leave home, and serving others through acts of charity. These small habits help make faith a natural part of everyday life instead of something that is only practiced at church. The author concludes by encouraging families not to wait until life is perfect before starting. Even one small act of prayer, love, or service can bring Christ into the home and strengthen a family's relationship with God and with each other.
