The Price of Being Christian

"Today, what matters is that the Church and theology rediscover the crucified Christ, to demonstrate to the world their freedom, if they truly want to be what they claim to be: the Church of Christ and Christian theology. This is, in fact, the only problem: either the Church and Christians rediscover that they are the Church of the Cross and followers of the Crucified One, or they cease to be the Church of Christ and Christians. All other problems are minor and can only be answered in this light. Progressivism, fundamentalism, conservatism, or openness are mere games if they are taken out of this context. The crucial question that each of us must answer is this: What do the Cross and the Crucified One mean for me and for the world? Because the great temptation for Christians today is this: Since the modern world cannot digest the Cross, let us make it a Christ for the benefit of the dolphins[*]; let us soften it; let us offer it a Jesus it can understand, perhaps it will accept a Christ Stripped of blood and all supernatural elements; let us give him a Teacher who is "useful" to improve the surface of this world, even if by doing so we have to strip it of everything that characterizes it; let us serve up a digestible faith; let us be like the teacher who offers as a solution to problems not what he believes is right but what his students desire and expect; let us adapt to the "mentality" of modern men, even if, in doing so, we stop giving them the very oxygen they need" (Martin Luis Descalzo, Life and Mystery of Jesus of Nazareth II).

We are made Christians through the sacrament of baptism; however, because of the difficulty of living the Christian life, we run the risk of being Christians, but not living as authentic Christians; Therefore, the Church, in the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World of the Second Vatican Council, warns us that: "Throughout human history there has been a fierce battle against the power of darkness, which, having begun at the origins of the world, will last, as the Lord says, until the final day. Enmeshed in this struggle, man must continually strive to do what is good, and only at the cost of great effort, with the help of God's grace, is he able to establish unity within himself" (n. 37).

In this regard, Cardinal Carlo Maria Martini wrote in his book, You Search Me and Know Me: "What the adversary seeks is to hinder the development of man in various ways, so that, closed in on himself, he falls into sadness, laziness, becomes selfish, jealous, hedonistic, slides into pleasure, incapable of true openness" (p. 42). And the Catechism of the Catholic Church warns us that the enemy can "darken our conscience" (n. 1865), that is, hinder our ability to hear and discern the invitation that Our Lord Jesus Christ continues to extend to each of us: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."

Question: Are you focused on following Jesus, carrying your cross each day, or on gaining your life for this world?

Filling the Empty Nest

“As a home grows quiet, couples can draw closer to God and each other through prayer and gestures of love”

In his article “Filling the Empty Nest,” Brian Caulfield explains how parents can adjust to life after their children grow up and leave home. He describes how he and his wife initially felt unsure about what their marriage would be like without their children around. They realized that they had spent so much time focusing on raising their children that they needed to rediscover their identities as husband and wife.

Caulfield explains that this new stage of life can be an opportunity for couples to grow closer to each other and to God. He encourages couples to pray together, pray for their children even when they are far away, and continue showing small acts of love and affection toward one another. He believes that an empty nest does not have to be a lonely or sad experience; instead, it can give couples more time to strengthen their marriage, deepen their faith, and appreciate each other.

Overall, Caulfield’s message is that when children leave home, parents can use the change as an opportunity to renew their relationship with their spouse and trust God to guide their family through this new stage of life.
